Can you describe and/or demonstrate the specific impact that TFN funding has had against your initial objectives?	<p>TFN funding when towards our 2023/24 Accelerator programme. On the programme we have been able to support 4 campaigns, with weekly campaigns coaching, strategy sessions, capacity support and delivery of expert masterclasses on supporter engagement, political influencing and campaign narratives.</p> <p>Each of the groups have made huge progress on the Accelerator and are all demonstrating clear impact. This video is a summary of our impact in the last year.</p> <p>Highlights include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - VICTORY! Charlotte Meijer (née Schreurs) has won her Open Justice Now campaign. Her ask was to make court transcripts of rape and sexual offences free to victims. The Government has announced they will make the change and has invited Charlotte to meet the Prime Minister. She was also featured on Women’s Hour here. - Harry from Free Leaseholders is gathering steam, he took to LBC to call out the Government’s slow action on changing the law for leaseholders. The next week the Housing Minister appeared on the SAME show to respond, and brought forward changes to the right to manage! We also supported Harry to connect with a team of lawyers to intervene in a High Court Challenge by Free Leaseholders, the intervention was denied by the Judge spoke highly of Free Leaseholders and Harry was able to make the case that people affected should be represented in the case. - Jo Cruse from Delivery Better has continued to solidify their movement. She was invited to meet with with Wes Streeting the Health Minister’s special advisor, and a Sky News special report will air soon.They now have over 6.7k followers and are pulling together a pitch to bring in funding to start to create a sustainable group with clear plan forward. - Munya from Regularise - It is a very difficult climate for Regularise’s campaign to support migrants. Despite this Munya has secured first piece of national coverage in the Big Issue and is pursuing FOI requests. - Zelda from Can’t Buy My Silence, we continued to support Zelda. The campaign has recently gained traction with Labour MP Louse Haigh picking up the cause and pushing for an amendment in the Employment Bill. Zelda has worked incredibly hard from engaging Lords, turning out MPs at key debates, launching a 38 Degrees petition and the results have turned around a Labour Government

	that initially said they would not legislate on NDAs. Now they say they will and we are entering final negotiations of what that would look like. It has been a huge effort by Zelda and is paying off!

How many indirect beneficiaries did the TFN funded project reach?	Many - Charlotte's victory along means that 26,298 victims of rape & sexual assault will get access to their court transcripts. Harry's progress means that 3.5M leaseholders now have right to manage. More will be impacted if Zelda is successful in changing the law on NDAs.
